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


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Testimony from the School of Purpose, Koinonia Bible Institute, SADOZ

Product Of His Thought

“And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness”.

- Genesis 1:26

You are not a bonus. You are a product of His thought. Before any producer makes a thing, He would first think about the purpose for which he wants to design the object. Take a potter or sculptor, for instance. Before he approaches his clay, he must have had a thorough thought about the things he wants to make out of the clay. In the same vein, God thought of you before making you. He is your Maker. He has a purpose in mind for making you. He made you according to that predetermined purpose, your background notwithstanding.

God does not mass produce! If God makes men as mass products, men would look totally alike, but science has clarified that one man is entirely different from another. There is only one kind of you. Your finger print is unique. The colour of your eyes is unique. Your voice is distinct. When you talk, those close to you know that it is only you that talks that way.

There is only one kind of you and that is you.

In Genesis, God said: “let us ‘*make*’ man in our own image”. The Hebrew word translated ‘*make*’ in the passage is ‘*asah*’ which means to fashion or produce. In other words, it means ‘*to invent*’. An invention is a type of thing that has never existed.

In Jeremiah 1:5, God said the same words to Jeremiah. He said that: “Before I *formed* thee in the belly I knew thee”. The word translated

'formed' here is the Hebrew word *'yatsar'* which means the same as *'asah'*. God is saying also to you that even before you got to the womb, He had known you. You have existed even before your mother was declared pregnant. You may want to ask where you were before you got to your mother's womb? You were alive in the thoughts of God. You were already formed in His thoughts. Before I sit to write this book, I have already written it in my mind. I have completed it in my thoughts. Before God created you, you were alive in His thoughts. So, you aren't an accidental product. You aren't a sudden event. You aren't a mistake. **You were consciously, intentionally, and deliberately fashioned and sent to the earth for a purpose.**

God had an intention. He had a purpose in mind. He had a plan. He wanted to achieve something. He wanted to solve a problem and so He created you as the solution!

You Are Not Ordinary

“But ye [are] a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvelous light”

- 1 Peter 2:9

Stop counting yourself among the masses. Stop categorizing yourself among common people. You are not among the ‘others’. You are uncommon, you are extra-ordinary. You are not just a number in census, you are a distinguished personality. I am not trying to psych you or motivate you; I am telling you who you are. **Until you know who you are, you cannot become who you are.**

Jeremiah looked down on himself as unfit, but God told Him that before He formed him, He had thought of him, He had known him; He had sanctified him and had ordained him as a prophet unto nations. Do you think God was fooling around when He made you? Do you think God creates things in excess? Do you think God has room for waste? Oh no! If you are God’s creation then, He didn’t make you as a mere man but as a great man. This has nothing to do with your nationality or circumstances of your birth. It has everything to do with where you came from- God’s thought. **Your original place of origin is God’s mind.**

There was a time I had to ask God. I asked if He created some people as ordinary people and some as great people. He said that there are too many people that He created to become great, but they couldn’t attain greatness, so He doesn’t need to create anyone as a mere man or as an ordinary man. You are ordained for a purpose; you are appointed to be a prophet; you are meant for greatness.

Your Background Notwithstanding

“Though thy beginning was small, yet thy latter end should greatly increase” - Job 8:7

Right now, what you see about yourself does not matter. Your background or past does not matter too. All that should matter to you is what God says about you. You are who God says you are.

When I read the part of the Bible where Jesus said that the poor shall always remain on earth, I knew that it had nothing to do with me. You may be comfortable because your parents are well to do and you are from a rich background, but may I tell you that there are many rich but common individuals. So, it is not just about money. It was discovered that 95% of the children of rich men in America are never successful. The reason is that ***success is not a function of genealogy, and riches is not tantamount to success.*** Besides, making meaning differs from making money. You can make money without making meaning, but you can't make meaning without making money.

He was making a great mistake to have compared himself with me. The university had a standard for first class, which was 7.0. I was not the standard. In fact, I was also after the standard. By making me his target it meant if I failed or had a lower point and he scored higher than me, he would feel fulfilled. Whereas, it shouldn't be like that. If he made the university standard his target, I would only be a motivation for him and not a competition.

That's why I say that there should be nothing like competition or comparison in the journey of success. The only competition that is permitted is a healthy competition. Someone said: *“if your friend fails, you feel bad but if your friend passes, you feel worse”*. That is a misplacement of emotion. No matter what you get as a student or make as a trader, your colleague should not be your standard, but the school or the market as the case may be. The Scripture says that those who compare themselves with themselves are not wise.

I won't be bothered if my friend's grades are higher than mine. What I would be bothered with is that I have not shown enough strength to get top grades. It doesn't matter what my friend grades is. It doesn't matter if all of us in the department get high grades. Our competition shouldn't be

amidst ourselves but against the school's standard. It is the same for the career world. Bringing down your colleague shouldn't be the goal, but breaking old records and setting new ones. If you do that consistently, **you won't need to look around to know who is competing with you, you would only need to look ahead to where you are going.**

John Mason's old school mate told him that every time he hears about his fame and achievements, he feels bad about himself because he has achieved little. John Mason replied; "will hearing about my failure make you feel good?" **Success is not about where your friend is; it is about where you are supposed to be.** After all, another person can't sit in your seat if you are in your seat. No man can take your place if you are in your place

Grace + Hard work

“Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord”.

- **Romans 12:11**

It is said that success is 99% grace and 1% hard work. We must understand grace and hard work from the right perspective. If you think hard labour is all it takes to succeed, then you need to take a walk around Nigeria. You need to take a look at the cart pushers and the market women. Fulfilment

“Ye are our epistle written in our hearts, known and read of all men” - 2 Corinthians 3:2

I have an unpopular view about fulfilment. Do you know that fulfilment is not really about riches or fame? Let me ask you a question. Where can you write your name that it can never be erased even when that thing is no more? Think about your answers.

I learnt of a white missionary who settled in a village in Benue State, Nigeria. The man was highly anointed with the gifts of healing. A Nigerian journalist who saw the grace of God upon him discovered him. The journalist saw it as a straightforward route for him to make money, while the white man would equally make money and fame. He told him that instead of ministering to villagers, they could organize crusades in big cities that will attract lots of people. He told the missionary that all he had to do was to give him his pictures and every other thing will be taken care of by him. The missionary told him to come back for his response. In a few days, the journalist was back and, to his surprise; the missionary told him God did not lead him to leave the people of the village. The Nigerian journalist was shocked. He said that he thought it was only blacks who were fools; he had never seen a foolish white man.

That white missionary may not be known to you and I but he is as important to those villagers as Pastor E.A Adeboye is to members of The Redeemed Christian Church of God. He is as important to those people as your spiritual father is important to you. That is fulfilment. It is not just

about the fame. I always say that, except for the Lord Jesus, no matter how famous a man is, he cannot be known by everyone on earth. There are men who have ruled your nation in the past that are not even known to you.

That white missionary died in that village and was buried there. He was fulfilled because he wrote his name in a place where it can never be erased by any man or washed away by any storm. He wrote his name in the heart of the people and before they die, they would pass on his name to their children and grandchildren. Those children will also pass it on to their own children and that way, his name will never be erased. I got to know about the missionary from a book written by one man on whose heart his name was engraved.

Do you want to be fulfilled in life? Do you want to be remembered even long after you are gone? ***Then the right place to inscribe your name is on the hearts of men.*** In our secondary schools and university campuses, we often see inscriptions like “forget-me-not”, “I was here”, and “1999 set” and so on. People write these on school walls and lockers. You probably also did the same. You can return to your school today and check if your name is still in those places. It’s all a matter of time before names written in those places will be wiped off. Many of those buildings have collapsed or have been renovated. But we can never wipe the names written on the hearts of men off.

Even names written on currencies and physical monuments do not last forever. I remember a governor in Nigeria who named a building after himself, when another governor was sworn in, he renamed the same structure and turned it into an isolation centre during the covid-19 outbreak.

Read through this extract:

Sixty-six years after Madam Aimee McPherson's (Founder, Foursquare Gospel Church) death, someone has this to say: 'My Grandpa always talked about you. When he was a kid, he and his family moved to California from Missouri, during the depression, and his family was starving and they met you (Madam Aimee) and you gave them a bag of vegetables, and some money, he never forgot it'. -Anonymous.

The grandpa was a child when he encountered the woman. The child grew up to tell his own children and grandchildren. One of the grandchildren was the one who told the story 66 years after the woman died. What better place is there to write your name?

I understood that secret a time long ago, and I decided to do all I can do to put a smile on the face of every man I meet, and ever since, I have never ceased to hear words like: "I thank God that I know you", "I wished I had known you earlier" etc. I can't count the number of homes where my name is on the lips of even the suckling. This is not to intimidate you, but to challenge you.

When Apostle Paul was going about his ministry, his aim was not to write the Bible. There was nothing like the printing press. He was only going about touching the lives of Gentiles and writing edifying letters to them, but today, over 1,900 years after his death, his name is still on our lips. Make up your mind now and write your name on the hearts of men. Make impacts in people's life. That is fulfilment.

Success Is In Succession

“But the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits” - Daniel 11:32

So far in this book, I have emphasized that you are not a bonus to this generation. Every child given birth to on earth is meant to be uncommon and unique. God never told man to dominate man, he told man to dominate animals and other creatures and not his fellow man. So, you shouldn't be subjugated or be dominated. That doesn't mean you can't serve another man, but your service doesn't make you a servant, it makes you a leader in the area of your duty. In places where there is subjection and slavery, it is an abuse to the human nature and that is why man will always rebel against such.

I have also mentioned in this book that success is not about comparing oneself with another. We must understand that we all have our individual destination and targets and everyone is meant to be focused on his own path without being envious of the other person. That is what will make you a success and a leader and not a subject. Life is often compared to a race. ***One of the rules of a race is to never look sideways but forward.*** When you look sideways at your colleagues in a bid to measure your progress by theirs, you begin to lose the race.

Never should you think that by bringing another man down, you will rise. Once a sprinter moves from his lane to another, he is disqualified. In the race of life, you should be focused and run in your own lane. Don't measure your progress by another man's progress. Break records not

people. Set new records and break it again to set new ones. Make your last success your biggest competition. That way, you will always be ahead.

Life is in stages and men are in sizes. There are two things that are certain in the journey of success. They are where you are and where you are going. A son of a senator may aim to be the president of the nation and a son of a carpenter may also aim to become the president of the nation. It is very possible for the two of them to become presidents, even though they are starting at different levels. In marathon races, everyone that runs does not start from the same point, but it doesn't mean that the person who started from the first lane would be the winner of the race. You are not in a disadvantaged position. All you need to do is to measure your progress per time. You know where you were yesterday and you know where you are going. The question to ask is whether you have made any progress. If you have made any progress at all, that is a stage of success recorded. What you need to do is to ensure that every step you take daily brings you closer to your destination.

Meanwhile, there would be challenges on your way. Even those who you think are very lucky have something working against them. ***Our challenges are unique to our paths.*** You may think that the son of a senator is better positioned to become a president than the son of a carpenter, but I have seen a man who became the president in my country just by telling people that there was a time when he had no shoes. He had what you may call 'sympathy' vote. Another man became president by painting a picture that he was not materialistic and that, in fact, he was very poor. And many people have also become presidents

and gotten the elective positions they desired because of their rich background, despite competing with those with poor backgrounds.

What I am saying is that **where you are starting from is not the issue; it is the moves you take that matters and there is no cheap journey to success.**

In movies, when actors plan a mission, no matter how perfect their plans would be, unforeseen circumstances would still arise. How will you handle those unforeseen circumstances on your journey to success? How will you navigate the hardest part of the route? You may know where you are and where you are going to, but what if the route is not clearly known to you? You have not taken that route before, but there is someone who knows the route perfectly. There is someone who has the roadmap of your journey to success. And that person is your creator. If you allow Him to lead you through, you will surely come through. You may not have the influence, you may not be able to commit fraud or compromise your faith, but once you know Him, He will bring you through. The book of Daniel states that those who do know their God shall be strong and do exploits. Once you do, the knowing, the exploits is a certainty.

“And the LORD said unto her, two nations are in thy womb, and two manner of people shall be separated from thy bowels; and the one people shall be stronger than the other people; and the elder shall serve the younger”. -Genesis 25:23

The situation would be worse if the child that scored higher than you is the next-door neighbour. This interpersonal competitive mentality was instilled into us and it never helped. Instead of pitching a child against another child, why not challenge such child to break the school jinx and get the highest score possible in his subjects?

Let us think outside the box. It is good to take the first position in your class but do you know that ***as far as your career is concerned, being the second in Command may be the BEST for you?***

Don’t get into the rat race, be composed and get settled. I am not talking about school exams right now; I am talking about the career world. For long, people have viewed the prophecy over the life of Esau and Jacob from the wrong perspective. God told their mother that there were two nations in her but the younger shall be greater than the older. Don’t forget that they were twins born within the same hour. There is no big deal if the older is the president of a

nation and the younger is the vice president. There is no big deal if Esau becomes a nation like France while Jacob becomes a nation like the United States. What matter is the individuals involved getting to their destination, which is becoming great nations.

It doesn't matter to me if my youngest sibling becomes the president of the nation and he appoints me as a minister. I don't know why people have problems with these things. There are many people who are honourable drivers and chefs to governors and ministers and they have no problem with that, but the problem comes in if that minister or governor is their younger brother. For God's sake, which one is better, to serve your younger brother or serve an unknown person?

Since I grew up, I have never prayed that I will be the greatest in my family; my prayer has been that I will fulfil my purpose in full and reach my destination and that they (my siblings) will fulfil theirs. It will be my joy that my younger ones fulfil their purposes even if it means that they will be richer and greater than me by human standard. It doesn't matter to me if my spiritual children become more famous or that God uses them mightier than He uses me. There is no way a man can be the greatest that ever lived; another person would appear that will be greater than him. My prayer and desire is that my spiritual children and mentees should be among those who will attain greater heights than me.

After all, Aaron and Miriam were older than Moses, yet Moses was their leader, but Aaron was also a leader and Miriam was also a leader. That I serve you doesn't mean that I am no longer a leader, and that you serve me doesn't mean that you are no longer a leader; we are both leaders in our purposes. **A leader somewhere is a follower elsewhere and a follower somewhere is a leader elsewhere.** Every father is a son to another father.

Placement

“Then Daniel requested of the king, and he set Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, over the affairs of the province of Babylon: but Daniel [sat] in the gate of the king” - Daniel 2:49

There is this feeling people have. They feel that when they serve someone; they are fulfilling the person’s purpose, not theirs. That is absurd. There is another negative mentality that people have; they all want to be the ‘oga’. What they don’t know is: ***everyone is number one somewhere and everyone can’t be number one everywhere!*** The location where God places you at a point in time cumulates to what your purpose is at the end.

I remember a time I told God: “why are you always making me a supporter of the head”. I was never a *head* leader at those times, even when everyone believed I was qualified. Let’s take it from the beginning; even though I was the best student in my primary school, they always gave me the second position and never made the class captain. The problem was that our proprietor’s son was in the same class with me and so he was always awarded the first position and class captain. I was the best student in my secondary school classes, but was never the class captain. I was always awarded the best student throughout my senior secondary school classes yet, it took the grace of God for me to be made one of the punctuality prefects.

Of all the units I partook of in my childhood Church, they always made me an assistant. I was the assistant prayer coordinator and assistant evangelism coordinator at a time. On campus, I was part of several

ministries besides my school fellowship, but never was I made the president. There were events where almost everyone believed I was the best for the position, but for some reasons, they appointed me to another role.

So, one day, I took stock of my life and I was forced to ask the Holy Spirit why I was never made a president or the *head* leader all my life but was always placed in a position and asked to ensure that I assist the president succeed in his tenure. I have gone through places where those appointed were my mentees or juniors. That day, God did not give me an answer and the truth is that, it never affected my work for God in any way. In fact, many mistook me for the president before they realized that I was not the president.

Those times when I was serving people, it never appeared to me as though I was serving them. For me, I was fulfilling my destiny and purpose. I was not desperate to head a ministry or be a chairman somewhere. All I wanted to do was to affect lives and anywhere I got the opportunity, I laboured as unto the Lord, not men. I remember working with a minister friend who actually wanted me to serve under him. I was ready for it. We were praying together one day when he started prophesying. God spoke through him that at that point in my life, I was not meant to serve under any man.

Today, I head a ministry by the grace of God but the irony I have seen around is that, there are men who aren't meant to be presidents of ministries who want to be and there are those who are meant to be but never thought of it and are gladly serving God where they are placed.

All of us will not be presidents, general managers, general directors, general overseers, etc. Some would be the vice, assistants, associates, etc. If everyone is the general overseer, who will be your local church pastor? And if everyone is the president, who will be the commissioner?

Life is in phases and men are in sizes, live your stage per time. Wherever you work, be diligent and don't cheat your boss in the service you render to him. Many of us are victims of unmotivated teachers, especially in public secondary schools; we all need to reactivate our services as unto God. See God as your employer and not the government or whosoever. Give in your best wherever you are serving today. It will accumulate to your greatness tomorrow. Discharge the best in that office. Discharge the best in that role. ***The position you are in today is a qualifying exam for your future aspiration.*** Let your focus be on making meaning and affecting lives, then greatness will come to you on a platter of gold.

Don't Be A Civil Servant

“Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do [it] with thy might”.

Ecclesiastes 9:10

At the first meeting I attended as an Associate Travelling Secretary in the Scripture Union, my boss; who was the Travelling Secretary, preached a message. The title of his message was “Don’t be a civil servant”. That title got my attention. I was wondering what he meant by saying we shouldn’t be civil servants when He explained to us the attitude of civil servants at their workplaces.

Using my environment as a case study, majority (not all) of civil servants show a high nonchalant and negligent attitude in the discharge of their duties. Those who attend public primary and secondary schools can attest to that fact. Those who have been to public hospitals and health centres can also testify to it.

Let me cite an example of my experience at two post offices. I needed to send some of our publications to South Africa and so I walked casually into a government owned post office to make enquiry. The attendant was eating and was on a phone call at the same time. That was around 10 am. The plate of food was on his desk and I had to stand there for some time. The other person seated behind him didn’t pay attention to me. Eventually, when he ended the call, I asked few questions, but he found it very difficult to answer. It was as though I asked him to vomit his throat. It wasn’t as if he didn’t know the answer, but he wasn’t ready to answer. I felt as though I was troubling him. I simply walked out and went to a privately owned post office that was on the other side of the

road. In that place, I met an attendant who attended to me enthusiastically. She answered all my questions and gave a detailed explanation.

When you demonstrate the attitude of a civil servant in the places, you serve or work today, you will reap the fruits eventually. And when you work actively, you will also reap the fruits.

My wife told me about a schoolmate of hers who was appointed as the secretary of a fellowship for two years. While still in school, he started his own ministry and, to my wife's amazement, the young man was going about looking for who would assist him to draft a letter. My wife said she wondered what he did as a fellowship secretary for two years if he couldn't write a letter. I tell the leaders serving in our ministry that there is no one who serves well in the ministry that won't be able to manage great enterprises or personal ministries in the future.

The problem of many third-world nations is that the persons who rule those nations cannot even manage grocery stores successfully. I know some leaders in our ministry who will surely succeed if they decide to start their own ministry, and I know those who may not readily succeed. It is not because they are not spiritual or holy, but because they are not diligent and faithful in the little they were asked to manage.

One of the things that worked in the favour of Barrack Obama when he was contesting for the presidency of the United States was the community service he engaged in as a youth. I used to say that anyone who leads well in the things of God or in services that attracts no gifts or rewards will easily succeed in many secular leadership positions.

Contentment And Progress

“But godliness with contentment is great gain” - 1 Timothy 6:6

Contentment, they say, is the best virtue. I told God several times that if my purpose is to serve Him as an assembly pastor or village pastor, He should let me know because I don't want to do more than that. And if it is for me to be a general overseer or president of a ministry, I don't want to do less. I remember saying to God at a point that I don't mind serving in a certain ministry for life. I was already a staff there and I wouldn't mind to continue with them. It took the burning bush experience for God to call me out of the place.

A survey was taken at a time and it was discovered that there are about three reasons ministers of God fall sick or die untimely. One major reason is what I call “*oversize*” and “*under size*”. For instance, a person who is meant to be a mission pastor but launches out into the city is an example of *oversize*, and a city pastor who ends up in a village is an example of *undersize*. In the same vein, someone whose purpose is to become a classroom teacher but become a lecturer would find it frustrating and someone who is supposed to be a lecturer but goes into the classroom would equally be frustrated. Oversize is not good and undersize is not better. ***You must get to understand where you belong and go for it.*** Even then, you shouldn't be a mediocre. Don't settle for less. ***Contentment, sometimes can be a vice instead of being a virtue.*** That you are a shoemaker doesn't mean that you should be poor or tattered. How about being ‘the shoemaker’ and not just ‘a shoemaker’? How about being ‘the lawyer’ and not just ‘a lawyer’? Be the best at what you do. Be the best you can be. That is fulfilment. From the knowledge and passion you have caught from reading this book, it is time to take the bull by the horn and go fulfil purpose and destiny.

Who Pushed Me?

There was a story of a king who wanted to marry off his princess to a brave man. The king organized a contest for all the suitors. On the D-day, he announced they were to swim in his Olympic-sized swimming pool and the first to make it out would be given the princess and wealth. The young men were excited, but before they could swim, they saw a crocodile lifted its head and before they could blink; they saw the second and the third crocodile. They all ran back,, but a man was already in the pool. They all watched him swim past the first crocodile in amazement and then the second, then the third. He came out breathing heavily! 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Receiving Salvation

Steps to Receive the Baptism of the Holy Ghost

7. As I pray for you, the Holy Spirit will give you utterances and you will speak it out. Note that utterance means any sound produced with the mouth. That means the utterance could be one syllable or two. It could be one word or more. Understand that you are the one that will pronounce the utterance in anyway it comes to your mind as the Holy Spirit gives you utterance.
8. When I pray for you, the utterance would come. Don't think you are the one thinking it, it is not you. Don't think you will be unconscious or lost, it is not so. Don't be bothered if you don't know the meaning just speak it. And keep repeating whatever comes to your mind.
9. Daddy thank you because you are a faithful God, you always hear me and you are eager to give us more than we are eager to ask. I pray for you: receive the Holy Spirit right now in Jesus Name.
10. Open your mouth and began to speak those tongues.

Steps to Receive Healing

1. **1Peter 2:24 says:** *He personally bore our sins in His [own] body on the tree [as on an altar and offered Himself on it], that we might die (cease to exist) to sin and live to righteousness. **By His wounds you have been healed.***
2. You have been healed. You have been healed even before you had that illness, what I'm about to do by praying with you is to proclaim your healing.
3. As I do that, the pains and symptoms will be no more.
4. After I pray for you move that part of your body just as though it was healed already because it is an instant healing.

5. I proclaim you healed and whole right now in Jesus Name. The last time you had that illness is the last you will ever have in Jesus Name.
6. Check it out and share your testimonies.

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
